Church Leaders Coming Next Week To Prince Rupert

Rev. Dr. Cochrane and Rev. Dr. G. A. Wilson Will Visit This City and Hazelton

Prince Rupert and Hazelton are two strategic points in British Columbia. They are to have special visits from two of the leaders of the United Church of Canada. Rev. Dr. Cochrane, the newly appointed missionary secretary of Toronto, and Rev. Dr. G. A. Wilson, superintendent of missions for British Columbia, will arrive in Prince Rupert from the south on Wednesday's boat. Oct. 22. Special conferences will be held here when a number of church workers and leaders will be present. On the following day, Oct. 24, they will proceed by the Canadian National Railway to Hazelton, where a service will be held in the evening and a conference with the workers will take place.

On Friday they are to proceed to Smithers by auto and will take the p.m. train for eastern points.

They are visiting as many important centres as possible with a view to speeding up plans for future activities in connection with some great and growing organizations of the church.

Rev. A. Wilson B.A. chairman of the Presbytery of Prince Rupert, and Rev. T. H. Wright B.A. secretary of the Presbytery, Hazelton, will have the honor of entertaining the distinguished guests from the east.

Dr. Cochrane is regarded as a Christian statesman, a hard worker and keenly alive to the needs of the great west as well as to the needs of the eastern provinces of the Dominion. He was pastor of Augustine Church, Winnipeg, before entering into the new work as secretary of home missions.

England Is Not Decadent Country Says Dr. J. A. West

Enjoyable Trip to Other Side of Atlantic Described to Rotary Club

Declaring that he had a wonderfully enjoyable visit, that Britain so far as he could see, was not going to the 'demition bow-wow's' just yet, and that the country was so interesting that Dr. and Mrs. Eggert, who had gone over on the same ship with him and planned to stay only a month, had not yet returned Dr. J. A. West told the Rotary Club yesterday about his visit to England and France in a delightfully informal and humorous talk.

The doctor told of the trouble of getting rooms in Montreal of the 'splendid' passage across on one of the C.P.R. Duchesses, where he met Dr. and Mrs. Eggert and with 'smooth seas and sunshine and plenty of bridge games enjoyed the trip immensely. Incidentally it was noticed he did not mention the return trip.

One thing that struck the genial doctor was the change in traffic since he was there before. He was much taken with the little motor cars, mostly driven by big men. The cars were so small that, if ditched they could be easily picked up and placed on the road. They travelled fast, dashed in and out among the other traffic and 'took a lot' of rough usage.

There was an enormous amount of building going on in London. Big apartment buildings were going up in an effort to solve the cost of living and domestic help problems.

Foreign Land
"England to the Egerts was a foreign land," declared Dr. West. They had to learn that an elevator was a lift, that two bits was a shilling, that a street car was a tram and many other differences of language. They talked to the policemen in an effort to "stump" them but the Bobbies always had an answer ready.

At the time the Wests were in London the two great features in the newspapers were the Sydney murder case and Snowden at the conference. People in England had feared the accession of the Labor Party as being likely to upset business, but instead of that they found the Labor Government tackling this question in a businesslike way and preventing France and Italy getting more than their share in the German reparations funds. So much did they love the country that they said they were absolutely a unit behind them and if Labor had gone to the country at that time, they would have carried the country by a huge majority.

Things in England did not seem to be going wrong. Money was being spent at the "drapers," people were driving all over the country and there seemed to be no hard times.

Flight to Paris
Telling of the flight to Paris with his daughter, the doctor said they were taken out to Crocydon in a bus weighed had their passports examined and then walked through into the plane. They had managed to get the best seats in a French plane, the English machines being already filled.
