Constable G. C. Sharpe, of

medal which is significant of the
amateur heavyweight boxing
championship of British Columbia.
Mr. Sharpe won this title last year at the Vancouver Navy
League Club in a four-round bout from Archie McDermott, the
Vancouver fireman, who represented Vancouver at the Olympic
games at Antwerp. Among the local boxer's other victories of
last year was a win over Ed. Green, of Capilano, another well
known amateur heavyweight of

**IMPROVEMENTS
AT SALT LAKES****Arrangements Made Last Night to Replace Float and Improve Facilities**

J. Myhill-Jones at the annual meeting last night offered the Swimming Club to tow a float to the landing place in the bay leading to the Salt Lakes providing a number of volunteers were willing to help. There were immediate offers of assistance, so it was decided that the offer of Mr. Jones be accepted with thanks and that preparations be made to get everything ready for the opening of the swimming season.

To Investigate

On Sunday morning the Oh Baby will take a number of members of the committee to the lakes to investigate conditions and consider the matter of improvements. Two new spring boards are to be installed at once and such other work done as it is found necessary. To finance this the public will be asked to become members of the Swimming Club and the city council is to be asked for the sum of \$300 and also to allow a tag day in the near future for this laudable purpose. Various societies in town will also be asked for aid.

It was pointed out at the meeting that this was the most popular holiday resort in the neighborhood and that the majority of those who went there were not swimmers. Everyone should help with the expense of keeping up the place and the only way to make a good many pay was to ask the city to make a grant from the general revenue.

The Provincial Government is completing the new walk from the bay to the lake which was commenced last year, but they do not stand any at the lakes or at the landing place. This is work for the citizens.

An effort will be made to secure the bathing section for the several swallows of sand to youngsters.
