Turning the focus of our attention upon manufacturing again, I have an idea it may be worth while for those who have the power by ownership and in whom authority has been vested by owners of property and business in this city to give proper aid to unemployed men and women and boys and girls who just leave school and for whom no work with fair remuneration exists in the city at present, to establish a new industry of manufacture of things made of wooden materials available in the surrounding district.
