It was his final suggestion of a united front just like the various united fronts organized in various countries including Spain by the Communists. This was to include all who were opposed to Chamberlain, no matter what their aims. He planned to take in Socialists and their cousins, the Communists, the Sinclair Liberals and any others. The Socialists refused to do that so Cripps toured the country. While the Cripps supporters shouted "Down with Chamberlain," the Socialists shouted "Down with BE READY FOR EXAMINATIONS. Cripps." The Trades Union Congress came out for a moderate policy, stating: "Merely to attribute the cause of unemployment to capitalism is out of date and irresponsible; nor can a cure be found in orthodox and rigid Socialist theories. There is no one cause and no one solution."

Mr. Baxter concludes "More and more the principles! of Socialism appear to the average Briton as first rate soap box stuff but not sound politics. Like Social Credit, Communism, Syndicalism and other devices, it was all right until somebody tried it out."
