

juries to her legs. Always she revealed great courage in the face of unfortunate breaks. At one time she had twelve failures in a row but she kept coming back in play after play, ever hoping to find a hit. She didn't mind appearing in half a dozen plays a season if the sixth one proved good.

Miss Brady was brilliantly educated, especially in the arts. She not only sang but played the piano and the zither. She spoke French, Italian and German and was wellyersed in Latin.

Fond of dogs, she always was surrounded by them and was an ex-president of the Tailwaggers' Club, a Hollywood group devoted

to protecting stray canines. Miss Brady was married in 1920 to James Lyon Crane, an actor who played opposite her in several dramas. They were divorced in 1922. A son, Donald Crane, was born March 10, 1922.
