ENGLISHMEN TOUR RUSSIA

With the Object of Developing Friendly Ties Between the Nations, Distinguished Travelers Visit Tsar's Empire. (Canadian Press Despatch.) London, Feb. 1.—Headed by James William Lawther, speaker of the House of Commons, a distinguished party, including a number of members of Parliament, peers, bishops and men of affairs, left for Russia today. The object of the visit is the desire of persons of various political views and public interests to develop further the ties that exist between the two countries.

WATER IS PLENTIFUL BUT NOT MORE THAN ENOUGH

SCANTY SNOWFALL THIS WINTER MAY MEAN REAL WATER SCARCITY IN SUMMER—SHOULD USE SAWATLANS SUPPLY AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

A visit on Sunday to the dams on the mountain showed that there is a good reserve of water stored now, and yet the inflow from the mountain to the dams is so exactly counterbalanced by the consumption in the city that the water in the dam from which the city supply is directly drawn cannot rise enough to flow over the spillway. There is enough water coming in on the mountain to render the pumped extra supply from Hays Creek unnecessary at present, but the Morse Creek pump replaces this augmentation source. Owing to the scanty snow fall this year the city will be confronted in the summer dry season with a prospect of water scarcity, which, in view of the increased consumption as compared with previous years, may amount to a real water famine if only the present supply is depended on. The urgent need therefore of having the Woodworth pipe line constructed as far as Shawatlans Lake and the Morse Creek pumping plant established there is obvious. Alderman Montgomery is the champion of this proposition principally in council as he has his doubts of the quality of Morse Creek water in summer, though it has passed the tests all right for this season.
