BRITISH BUSINESS BETTER

J. M. Keynes, making an economic forecast in the monthly letter of the Royal Bank of Canada, suggests that the volume of business in Great Britain during the present st. Louis financial year will exceed that of any other year by a substantial margin. This prophesy is based mainly on the fact that the government proposes to spend at least six hundred and thirty million pounds on the defence budget, of which not less than three hundred and fifty million pounds will be borrowed. This spending is twice as great proportionately as that of the United States under the Roosevelt administration. This will give employment, it is estimated, to approximately a million more people. At present the number of unemployed in Britain is set at a million and a half. While the situation resembles to some extent that in Germany it is with the difference that, while Great Britain can hope to finance the large expenditures, Germany, Italy and Japan cannot hope to do so. In those countries, as a result of investment in war preparations, the standard of living is falling. In Britain tain the tendency is for it to rise.
