# EDITORIALS

### SERVICE CLUBS

Service clubs are comparatively new organizations. They were started only a few years ago by the man who organized the first Rotary Club in the city of Chicago. It was the idea of Paul Harris who thought it would be a good thing for a few friends to meet once a week, people who were congenial and who could help each other in business or profession. That was the selfish idea the club very soon outgrew and instead devoted its energies to public service.

No sooner was it demonstrated that a service club could be a successful institution than many others were started. There are the Kiwanis, the Gyros, the Lions, the One Hundred Per Cent Club and others. The idea of each was somewhat similar to undertake something of an unselfish character for the good of the community in which the club operates.

Possibly the most important function of all these clubs is the opportunity it gives for men to get together, meeting at the luncheon table and getting to know each other. It is of particular value to the business and professional man because it gives him a chance to think of something other than making money. It tends to give him a new orientation toward life.

There is a tendency for people to fall into a groove. They meet the same people, discuss the same subjects and tend to become narrow in outlook. By attending a service club once a week they meet new people, discuss new subjects, get new points of view, broaden their minds.

Most people have to eat lunch somewhere. Instead of eating at home or at a restaurant counter that day they eat with other members of the club.

Members of these clubs are expected to do anything the club assigns to them as public duties. Politics are taboo but yet political questions are discussed among the members. Usually the club invites some person to give a short address at each meeting, sometimes one of their own members and sometimes some prominent person on the outside. As a rule the addresses are of an educational nature.

In some clubs members are asked to prepare talks on certain assigned subjects. It is found that the talks of members are usually much more interesting than those of the professional talker. They may not be as fluent but they are more meaty.

When service clubs started, many prophecies were made that they would die a natural death very soon. They did not die but are becoming more numerous and more forceful than ever. The Junior Chambers of Commerce are somewhat along the line of the service clubs only they do not make professions of public service although devoted to that kind of work, carrying it out energetically.

The Chambers of Commerce serve the interests of the business and professional section of the community. The service clubs undertake work usually on behalf of the under-privileged, the suffering or sometimes of the community as a whole.
