

C.P.R. steamer Princess Norah, Capt. William Palmer, arrived in port at 10 o'clock this morning from Vancouver and sailed at 11:30 for Skagway and other Alaska points.

## WAS NOTED FINANCIER

MONTREAL, Jan. 12: (CP)—Ward C. Pitfield, prominent Canadian financier, known from one end of Canada to the other, died here last night. He was president of the firm of bankers and investment dealers bearing his name and was a member of the Montreal Stock Exchange. Many industrial and business concerns with the directorates of which he was identified included the British Columbia Telephone Co. of which he was vice-president. He had been president of the Canadian Investment Bankers' Association.

Born at Saint John, New Brunswick, July 21, 1892, Mr. Pitfield served in France and Belgium during the Great War as a lieutenant in artillery, later becoming major in Canada commanding the 24th Battery.
