# IS BURIED IN DEBRIS

Youth Has Harrowing All Night Experience in Utah Snowslide Which Killed Two Persons

BINGHAM, Utah, Feb. 10: (CP) Rescuers removed a youth wrapped in bed clothing from debris of a snow avalanche after he had been buried all night. There are two known fatalities and a third person is missing. The youth, Duchin Thomas, was injured seriously in the slide which carried away the top of his home, killing his mother and sister. The missing man is Sam Narich, a boarder.
