This proposed new policy of the United States may prove to be the turning point in world history unless the Senate lays its hand on it and destroys it as it did in the time of President Wilson. However, President Roosevelt. is in closer touch with Congress than was President Wilson. He knows his people better, and the probability is that his recommendations in this respect will be adopted. Germany has been playing into his hands by her interference in the affairs of neighboring countries and by reaching out to the American continent. Evidently our neighbors to the south have come to realize that it is impossible to play a lone hand and continue to reap the profits to be made from international trade while others are fighting the hattles.
