Success of Deputation Waiting on Sir William MacKenzie and Members of Dominion Government in Regard to New Line.

That the Hudson Bay Railway Also maintains weekly service to Queen out of Prince Albert will be started this year and that in the ensuing twelve months at least 50 miles of it will be ready for traffic is the promise given by Sir William Mackenzie to a deputation from the northern city, which visited him recently at Ottawa. The deputation in question, consisting of J. E. Bradshaw, member for Prince Albert City in the Alberta Legislature; A. J. Manville and Allan Holmes, waited upon Sir William to ask from him a definite declaration as to his intention regarding Prince Albert and the Hudson Bay Railway, following which they called upon Hon. Robert Rogers, Hon. F. Cochrane, Hon. Sam Hughes and other members of the Dominion Government, who expressed themselves favorably regarding the Hudson Bay route reaching out from Prince Albert.

Speaking of the projected line, Mr. Bradshaw declared the other day that it will open up an ex- J. G.
