Courage of English Peer Gave Basis For Canadian Reforms

TORONTO, July 18: (CP)-Responsible government was not a new doctrine when Lord Durham proposed it for Canada but "there may be as much originality in applying an accepted creed to novel conditions as in inventing a new! one," Lord Tweedsmuir writes an historical review.

The Governor-General's article is one of five commemorating the Durham report which grew out of troubled times in the Canadian colonies and foreshadowed political and administrative reform years ago, Lord Tweedsmuir points out that responsible governmen had long been accepted Britisl policy ."Durham's achievement lay n the fact that he had the courage to give it a wider application to shake off the dead hand of colonial office paternalism and to trust the Canadian people."
