Dease Lake Destination of Prospecting Party Financed by Bostrom & Harris—Big Gold Deposits Said to Exist.

Jno. Bostron, contractor on the railroad work, and Al. Harris, mine operator, have financed a prospecting party, headed by Al. Young and Mr. McDougall, for a year's trip to the Dease Lake country, 700 miles from Rupert on the Arctic watershed. Dogs and supplies will be shipped from Rupert to Wrangell, Alaska, when the expedition will start inland via the Elitine river. Messrs. Young and McDougall have both been in the country before and report big deposits of alluvial gold.

New Placer Discovery.

What is reported as an exceptional discovery of placer gold on the Linkenson river, thirty miles south of the junction of the government telegraph line with the Naas river, has caused a mild stampede of Stewart prospectors to the scene of the strike. Prospectors who have been in the district report it as an extremely favorable locality for gold.
