Waterfront Whiffs

Herring Seining About Only Fishing Now Going On—Few Trollers Out—Tuscan on Way to Seattle

About the only fishing activity in this district just now is the herring seining for reduction plants which, for the time being at least, is centralized at the head of Prince Rupert Harbor in Tucks Inlet where a fleet of eight seiners with almost as many packers has been operating during the past week or so. A few trollers have been out picking up the odd spring salmon but the extremely bad weather of the past week has mitigated against operation. Tucks Inlet and Port Edward reduction plants, both close to the city, have been operating in full swing and Pacofi on the Queen Charlotte Islands has started up. Down the coast Namu reduction plant is ready to run as soon as fish are available. No report has been received as to whether or not the Butedale reduction plant will operate.

The well known Ketchikan hall-boat Tuscan, with Capt. Angelson and his family on board, arrived in port this morning from the north, being on the way to Seattle.

A good crop for 1938 is reported by eel fisheries, a curious Canadian industry which lives almost exclusively on exports to New York, Chicago, Berlin, Stockholm and Brussels. Canadians themselves eat only a small fraction of the yearly catch. The chief fisheries are near the historic Isle of Orleans, within sight of Quebec City in the River St. Lawrence, and at St. Johns on the Richelieu River, near Montreal. The former trapped 800,000 pounds of live eels this season and the latter 100,000 pounds. Live eels sell in New York City among the Italian population for 30 cents a pound, while the balance of the "crop" is exported frozen and brings the fishermen about six cents a pound. The Island of Orleans catch is marketed by a co-operative. The St. Johns fisheries are owned by Pierre Thout, 82 years of age, but still hale and hearty. The Thout family has been licensed to catch eels in the Richelieu River for more than 100 years.

Shark Fishing May Prove Profitable

YARMOUTH, N. S., Jan. 14: (CP)—Yarmouth County fishermen these days are discussing possibilities of a new source of revenue. A letter to Stanley LeBlanc of Wedgeport from a west coast company offered to test oil from the livers of sharks caught off the coast with a view to exploring its commercial possibilities. Not only shark oil hides and even fins, the latter for the Chinese market where it would be sold as a soup ingredient, were in demand, the letter said.

Population Of Winnipeg Now Moves Upward

WINNIPEG, Jan. 14: (CP)—Population of Winnipeg is commencing to pull up again. This year it is placed at 313,230, a gain of 3000 over a year ago but still down from 23,000 from 1929.
