### SUCCUMBS TO WOUNDS

Netorious Gangster, Shot Down in Attempting to Get Away From Alcatraz, Dies

WASHINGTON, D.C., Jan. 14: (CP)-Doc Barker, noted gangster and one of five prisoners who attempted to escape from Alcatraz Prison early yesterday, died last night of wounds received when he and another of the quintet were shot before being recaptured. Barker was shot through the head and body by bullets of guards.

Warden Johnson officially advised the Department of Justice here of Barker's death.



### Loyalists Admit Danger Of Capital Falling; Every Man Able To Fight Off To Front

BARCELONA, January 14: (CP)-The Spanish government no longer makes any attempt to conceal the danger to this city, the provisional capital, in the advance of the insurgent forces along the coast.

Barcelona has largely become a city of women, children and old men as every available man has gone up to the front in the final effort to stay the rebel drive. Those too old, young or otherwise unable to fight actively have been left behind to help the women build fortifications.

Another furious government attack west of Madrid was reported last night in the effort to divert the insurgents' pressure from the Catalonia area.

Government airplanes are reported to have attacked five insurgent gunboats and driven them back to their base at Majorca in the Balearic Islands.

The advice of Chancellor Hitler to Premier Mussolini to defer his colonial demands for a year is viewed with some suspicion. It may merely be a move to lull the democracies into slowing up their rearmament programs.
