Government leaders, men in authority, men of influence, journalists and publicists, all have a serious ressponsibility on their shoulders. They must know that the populace is in the highest degree fitted to hear and heed the language of reason, good sense, legitimate sentiment, and sane and reasonable moderation. This sort of lan- well 3 guage French-speaking Canadians can understand as well as English-speaking Canadians. And it is the only language which ought to be employed.

Woe to those who, through demagogy, personal vanity or self-interest, may seek to fish in troubled waters and create dissension among Canadians. Against such persons we would urge the most stringent application of the rigorous laws prevailing in times of national emer-

gency. And when we have silenced the advocates of dissen-! sion and hatred, we will be able to bring about the holy union which we so greatly need in preparation for the future. For we must unceasingly proclaim this truth: "Tomorrow, we must again live together!"
