# CHURCHMAN

Monsigner Michael Lavelle, Rector Of St. Patrick's Cathedral For More Than Half a Century,

NEW YORK, October 18: (AP)-Monsignor Michael J. Lavelle, rector of the famous St. Patrick's Cathedral of the Roman Catholic Church in Manhattan, died las night at the advanced age eighty-three years. He was one the United States most celebrated churchmen.

On a brisk fall day in 1858, Patrick Lavelle, a contractor who lived in New York's swarming lower East Side, took his two-year-old son Michael uptown along the ,hen-pastoral reaches of upper Fifth Avenue to see the laying of the cornerstone of the new St. Patrick's Cathedral.

Half a century and more later, Monsignor Michael J. Lavelle could have been found at the same spot, for since 1886 he had served as rector of that famous Roman Catholic Cathedral.

Ordained a priest in 1879, Father Lavelle entered St. Patrick's as an assistant in the same year, and so began an uninterrupted term of service in a single church which was unprecedented in the Archdiocese of New York.
