ne third edict was an unqualiapproval and acceptance of the conditions before agreed between Yuan Shikai and provisional president of the iblic. This caused some sureven to the republicans aselves, as they fully expected Manchus, at the last moment, ld make a strong demand that many privileges be saferded. The conditions make dsome monetary provisions all the royal family, and persion is given for its members continue to reside in Pekin, of the palaces being specially ignated for the purpose.
