### France Refuses Recognition And Quickens War Preparation

PARIS, March 18: (CP)- The French government today dispatched a note to Berlin declaring that France does not recognize the German occupation of Czechoslovakia as legitimate. Announcement of the note was made just after Premier Edouard Daladier, seeking drastic decree powers, had won a 334 to 258 vote of confidence on the issue from the Chamber of Deputies.
