### PRESIDENT OF CHINESE REPUBLIC A CHRISTIAN.

So much have things quieted down in Honan Province and, in fact, in the whole of the district given over to the Presbyterian Church that all the Presbyterian women missionaries have returned from Shanghai to their posts in the interior of China. Reports just received at the Presbyterian mission offices are of the most reassuring kind and indicate that so far as Honan and the adjacent province are concerned the troubles are over.

In view of the fact that the President of the new republic is a Christian and most of the leaders of the revolutionary party have either become Christians or are favorably inclined toward Christianity, the various missionary boards of America believe the time is ripe to Christianize China and have determined to make a special effort to Christianize her at this time; and in SECOND - AVENUE order to prevent overlapping and to more effectively deal with the problem, a general conference of all the mission boards of America having missionaries in China has been called for February 27th in New York.

# "WATER POWERS OF CANADA" FIRST INVENTORY ISSUED

CONSERVATION COMMISSION ISSUES REPORT ON CANADA'S WATER POWER RESCURCES-AN EXHAUSTIVE COMPEN-DIUM OF USEFUL INFORMATION WITH FINE MAPS.

"Katada River, 300 ft., head, 15,000 horse power. Proposed to develop 8,000 horse power for Prince Rupert," is a quotation "Black Hand" Conspiracy Discovfrom the new work "Water Powers of Canada," just issued by the Commission of Conservation. This large and interesting power developed from water power in Canada. Every phase of the subject from the laws governing the disposition of water powers in the various provinces

to the actual physical data regarding each individual water 319 3rd Avenue power concerning which information was obtainable is treated in the report.

A chapter is devoted to the water powers of each province in TERRACE which the general features of the province as regards water power development are discussed and an outline given of the law whereby powers are granted or leased to private individuals or corporations. The larger developments are also described. The statistical data given in tabular form includes the height of the fall, the horse power that may be developed, the present development and the main uses to which the lower is applied, such as lighting, pulp and paper making, etc. Reference is also made to the possibility of increasing the amount of power developed by storage reservoirs and dams

where such are feasible. The broad and optimistic statements very often made on the platform and in the press regarding our vast water power resources are deprecated. To quote from the report: "General statements implying that the aggregate amount of water power must be great because the total water area, or watershed area, is so great, or because there are so many lakes and rivers, are generalities to be considered of very

In fact, all the information regarding the maritime provinces powers was \$6.00 obtained in this way last year by the experts of the commission. The data regarding the western provinces was found to be so incomplete that it was decided to make special investigations of the powers in those provinces, the results of which will be published next year in the form of a report on the "Water Powers of Western Canada." The engineers of the commission are now engaged upon this work.
