British Territorial Army Is Being Doubled; Move To Head Off Hitler Continues

LONDON, March 29: (CP)- Prime Minister Neville Chamberlain announced in the House of Commons today that the strength of the British territorial field army would be doubled, giving it a total of 340,000 men. The announcement was made following a meeting of the cabinet which considered conscription and other measures fitting Great Britain to take the lead in efforts to block German expansion. The Premier indicated there would be no conscription.

Earlier it was said that there had been discussions with France regarding compulsory national service but "it cannot be divulged what took place at the private conversation."

Number Of Credit Unions Increases

Total of 148 Now Being Operated in Nova Scotia

HALIFAX, March 29: (CP)-The number of credit union societies operating in Nova Scotia increased during 1938 from 105 to 148, according to the report of the inspector of credit unions tabled in the provincial legislature. Total membership at the end of the year was 22,-869 as compared with 17,173 at the end of 1937.

Share capital totalled \$555,409, a gain of almost \$150,000. The amount loaned to members during the year was \$652,671 as compared with \$646,349 in the previous 12 months.
