Can Now Telegraph Into the Peace River Country.

(Special to Daily News.) Edmonton, Feb. 15.—The Canadian government's telegraph line is now completed to Dunvegan, on the Peace River extension.

## WAITING FOR SIR DONALD

Manager of Portland Canal Short Line and of Sir Donald Mann's Properties on Glacier Creek.

Vancouver, Feb. 13.—Mr. Neil McLeod Curran, manager of the Portland Canal Short Line Railway, with headquarters at Stewart, is in town for the purpose of conferring with Sir Donald Mann, the owner of the railway. He also has charge of the latter's mining properties in that district.

The development of the Ben Bolt and Jumbo properties on Glacier Creek has been prosecuted all winter. Both have a considerable tonnage blocked out and will probably enter the shipping list with the building of an aerial tram and concentrator plant from the ore bins to the railway track. The values are in silver, lead and gold.

Mr. Curran was formerly in charge of the North Star, an East Kootenay silver-lead property controlled by Sir Donald and which paid over \$500,000 in dividends.

#### COAL CLAIM ACTION

Graham Island Coal Lands Involved in Legal Dispute.

In the Supreme Court at present there is pending a lawsuit affecting some 22,000 acres of coal area and the sum of \$220,000, the land being on Graham Island. The Canadian Development Co., Ltd., has filed a statement of claim at Vancouver for \$113,000 claimed as balance due on second payment and full amount of third payment on 36 coal claims. The Graham Island Collieries counter claim that the first named company is trying to carry through the sale of the claims to them at \$10 an acre when they purchased them at \$4.50 per acre, and seek to have judgment for possession of the lands at the lower price.

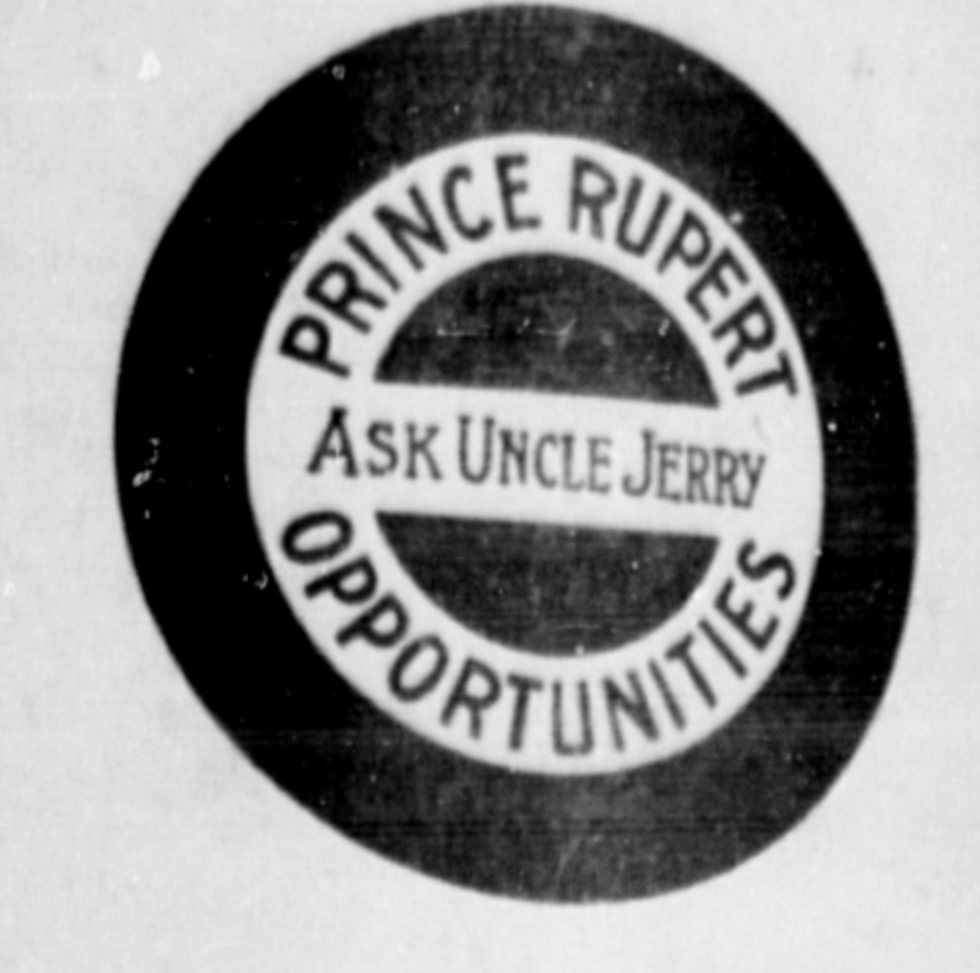
