DENOMINATIONAL TROUBLE

It is curious that there have been more quarrels, disputes, wars and family divisions over religion than any other single cause. Just now some members of one of the minor religious divisions are all worked up over the fact that two of their members were arrested and punished for distributing a religious tract. Perusal of this tract shows that it seems to be primarily an attack on the doctrines and methods of the largest religious group in Canada yet it was distributed right in the stronghold of that church.

we take it that any person has a right to advocate any religious doctrine it wishes but it has no right to say that those who hold some other view are hypocrites or that they are representatives of the Devil or in any other way to speak slightingly of what they hold dear. Suppose some person were to write to this paper and state that the members of this objecting set were liars, hypocrites or representatives of the Devil, it would be not only inadvisable and contrary to our policy to publish it but would also be illegal. We could be arrested for allowing such statements to be made in this newspaper.

One denomination has just as much right to advocate its religious theories as another but no person or church or sect has a right to make base insinuations in regard to another. This is not only in bad taste but is illegal. Perusal of the tract makes it clear to us why it was suppressed and the distributers punished. Newspapers would not be allowed to make insinuations such as were made in that tract so why should others.
