Reichsbank Is Brought Directly Under Nazi Party Control

BERLIN, January 20: (CP)-Dr. Hjalmar Schacht was deposed by Chancellor Adolf Hitler today as President of the Reichsbank, the minister of economics, Walther Funk, to be his successor, In making the announcement, Chancellor Hitler commented that "unified leadership is necessary in economics and

The removal of Dr. Schacht places the Reichsbank directly Under Schacht it had been independent.

Funk is ordered to transfer the institution "into a German bank of issue unconditionally subjected to sovereignty of the state in conformity with National · Socialist principles."

It has been known for a long time that Schacht has been in disfavor with Hitler. In October 1937 he was relieved as minister of economics but retained the presidency of the Reichsbank.
