Irish Fusiliers Entertain People Of Interior Community At Smoking Party

SKEENA CROSSING, Nov. 18.—Never was a gayer party staged at Skeena Crossing than that last Saturday night in observance of Remembrance Day when the local detachment of Irish Fusiliers undertook to entertain the people of the community who turned out en masse. Waterfront Whiffs

Little Doing in Way of Fishing Operations These Days—Preparing for Halibut Conference in Seattle



A few local halibut boats are still out black cod fishing. Others which had been on the Queen Charlotte Islands dogfishing for the Pacofi reduction plant have returned to port. The run of herring is still being awaited. Salmon trolling is again permissible but few, if any, boats are out. Thus the fishing situation hereabouts can be summarized these quiet days.

Local halibut boat owners and fishermen are already beginning to line up important representations which they will make to the annual conference with the International Fisheries Commission to be held in Seattle December 13. The main burden will be the securing, if possible, of a better "break" for the smaller vessels of this fleet in the regulations which, as they stand at present, preponderantly favor the big Seattle operators. A. J. Whitmore of Ottawa and L. W. Patmore K.C. of Victoria, Canadian members of the Commission, are expected in Prince Rupert for preliminary meetings prior to the Seattle conference.

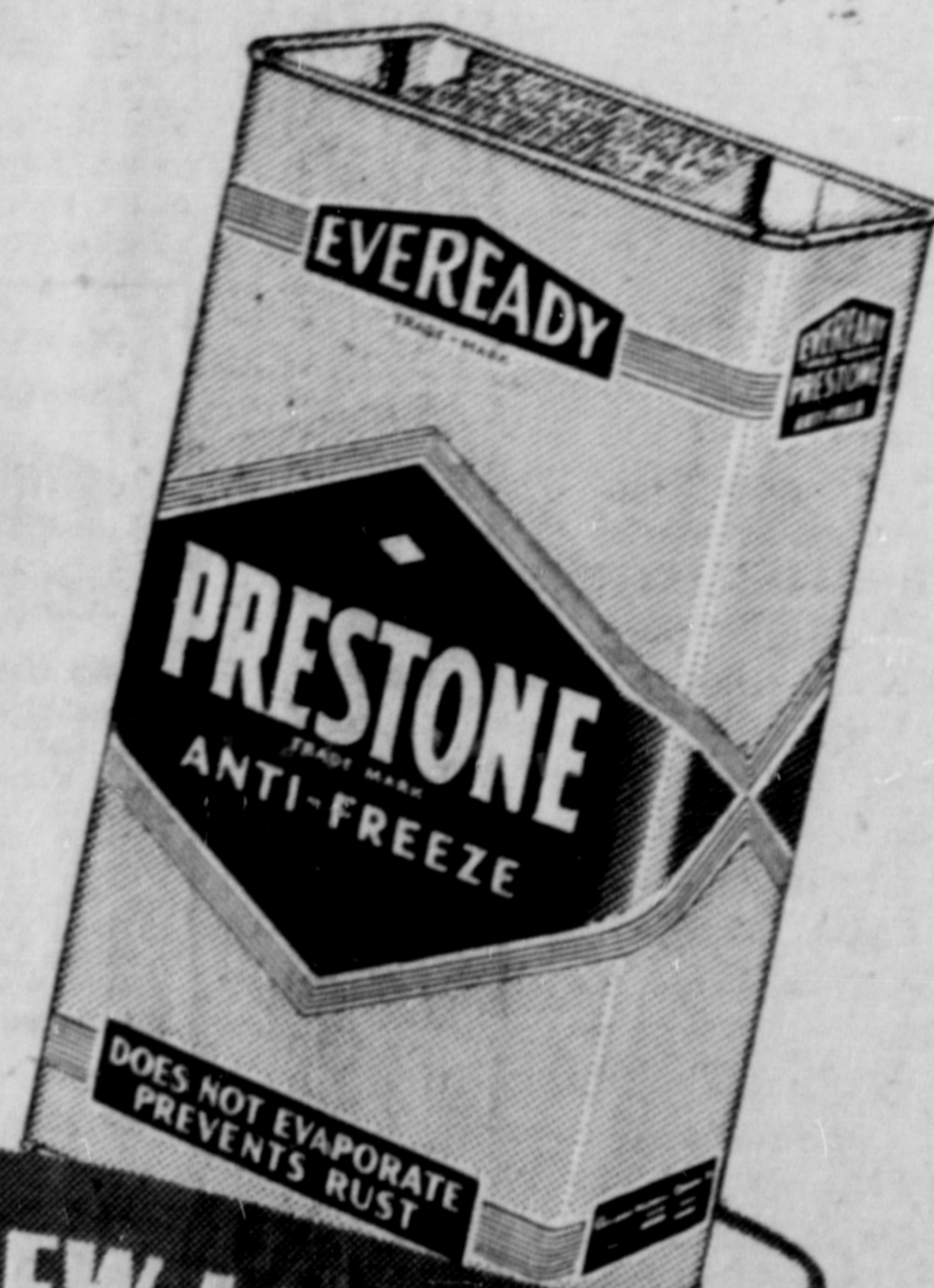

Fingers And Toes Merit Gratuities

LONDON, Nov. 18: (CP)—A Royal warrant covering payment for non-regular soldiers and officers of the United Kingdom forces, women nurses and women members of military organizations includes a schedule of "gratuities" for specified minor injuries rated as less than 20 percent disability. For loss of the tip of a little finger, an officer will get \$71.20, a soldier \$35.60. For the same injury women will be given \$48.95 and \$26.70 respectively. Toe joints are valued at from \$48.95 to \$356.00, ears from \$97.90 to \$284.80.
