The auditorium was filled to capacity with interested and excited students.

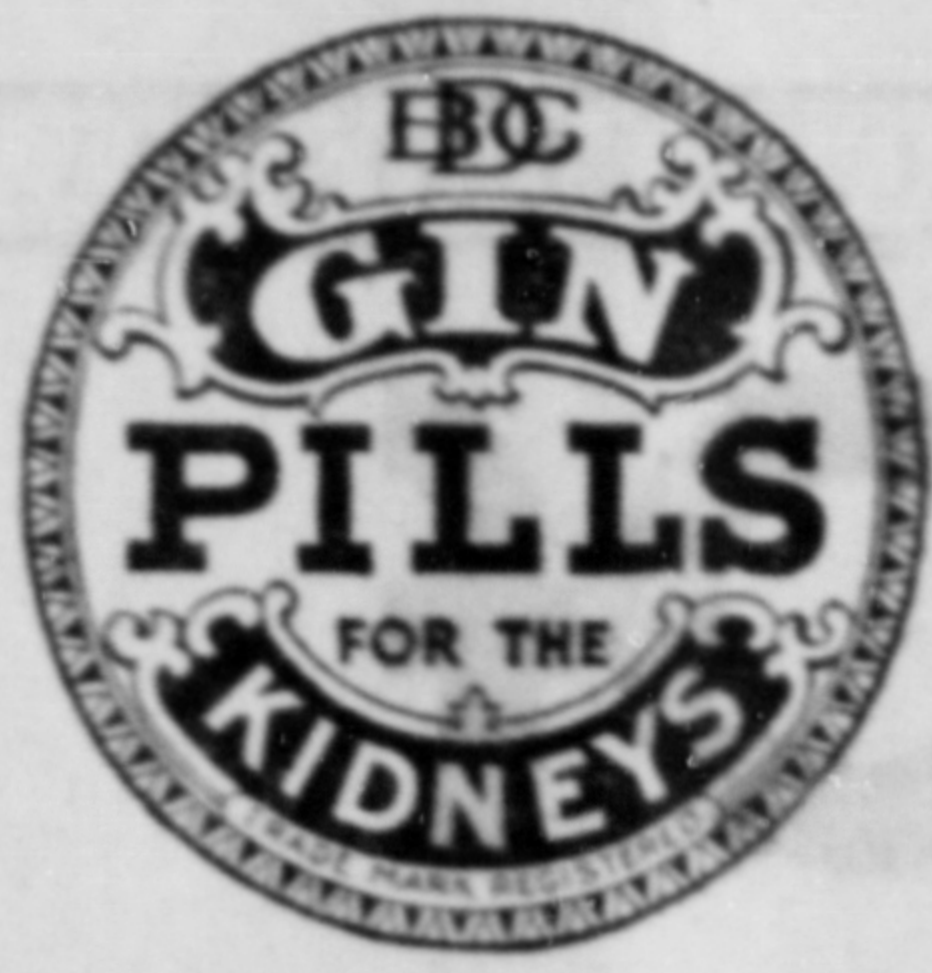
After the school gymnasium is completed the boxing club, with President Albert Mah and Manager Don McConver as officers, hopes to progress rapidly and recruit many new members.
