It may seem that this absorption of the transportation systems smacks too much of socialism but it is similar to the post office in being purely a public service system. With the C.N.R. already in the hands of the public and with the shareholders of the C.P.R., through their president, urging unification, there seems to be nothing in the way of completing the deal. Evidently, as time goes on the condition will become worse unless something is done to prevent the present unfair competition with the railways by trucks and buses.

If the C.P.R. is not prepared to accept this deal it should stop the present expensive campaign for unification of the systems. It is a sure thing that no government will hand over the C.N.R. to the C.P.R., either to operate or to absorb. Only a government can hold a monopoly. Only a government could include all public transportation in the system and thus save the highways much of their present cost of upkeep. Action of this kind by the federal government would be a great aid to the provincial governments in providing good highways for the use of automobiles.
