Camosun Passed Boat with Sailors from the Carrie Dove Wrecked Near Sink Island—No Aid Needed.

Yesterday the Camosun passed in Discovery Passage the crew of the wrecked schooner Carrie Dove. The men were in an open boat and signalled the Camosun that they were going to stand by the stranded vessel, which is on a rock near Sink Island. They asked that a wireless be sent to Seattle regarding the wreck, and this was done by the Camosun operator. The men were in no danger, and had abundance of provisions.

ANOTHER BIG MINING DEAL

Victoria Men Buy Great Western Mine—Will Start Work at Once—Ore Assays High—Property on Four Mile Creek.

A mining deal involving a consideration of \$10,000 was consummated today when W. G. Dickenson and W. M. Dean, both of Victoria, purchased from Mr. Duncan of Hazelton the Great Western mine on Four Mile Creek, near Hazelton. Assays as high as \$750 per ton in silver and lead have been obtained on the ground, and it is regarded as an extremely likely producer. An extensive plan of development will be immediately commenced by the new owners, a shaft will be sunk and tunnels driven at different places on the vein.

MILLIONS HUNG OUT TO DRY

Sequel to Great Fire in New York Enough to Make Laundry Manager Think He Has Had a Bad Dream.

New York, Feb. 14. The staff of the United States Life Insurance Company has just completed a ten-days job of washing and ironing which is probably without precedent in downtown New York.

The "wash" which they hung on lines strung across the vault of a big Wall street bank and then ironed out carefully with electric irons, consisted of 3,000 pieces of paper, representing more than \$3,000,000. The securities were salvaged from the subcellar of the burned Equitable building a fortnight ago. Thousands of gallons of water had filtered through them while they lay there, and the papers were soaked almost to a pulp when removed from their resting place.
