EDITORIALS

CANADA UNITED


Canada is united in face of danger. That is a great feature of the preparedness campaign which is now in progress. The leaders of the Conservatives, Social Credit and Co-operative Commonwealth Federation parties are to be congratulated on the stand they have taken. It is very important at a time like this that minor differences be dropped or postponed and that all turn their faces to the common enemy.

THE SITUATION

It is easy for the people here to look across Europe and wonder why this or that is not done. We can depend upon it that Great Britain and France are doing what is strategically the best. They have a plan and naturally we cannot know what that plan is. We must sympathize with Poland in being overrun by the Germany armies but it would have been impossible to move British or French troops to Poland in sufficient numbers to be of any material aid. Germany would see to that. Possibly an attempt to do that is what the Germans would have liked.

NATIONAL GOVERNMENT

It is suggested that, in view of the present situation, a national government should be formed at Ottawa. "Saturday Night" suggests that Dr. Manion and Mr. Woodsworth should have seats in the cabinet but it points out that this is not the kind of national government suggested by the critics of the Prime Minister. "They seem to feel that a national emergency is a heaven-sent opportunity for getting into the seats of power a class of men who may be able to get themselves elected to boards of directors but have never shown the slightest sign of being able to get themselves elected by popular franchise even to a board of school trustees." The journal suggests that these men might be useful in connection with the management of a munitions bureau but doubts their usefulness in political affairs.

FRENCH AND BRITISH CONTINUING INVASION

have been advancing rapidly into German territory. The same French sources declare that there has been heavy hand to hand fighting between the infantry forces, the French advance being supported by withering artillery and aerial fire. The line of French penetration is said to be along a distance of 125 miles between the Rhine and Moselle Rivers with the general objective along the Moselle and off to Saarbrücken, important industrial centre of the Saar Valley. Here there is a gap in the Siegfried Line and the area is not as heavily fortified as along the Rhine. Saarbrücken is fifty miles away from the frontier and four hundred miles from Berlin. The French troops are also said to be pressing towards Frankfurt.

French Fight Forward

The French army reported tonight that it had fought its way into the German forest of Bienwald, just north of Lauterbourg, French key to the western front. Meantime British reinforcements were moving up to join forces. French and British general staffs were in consultation.

This morning's Communique No. 7 from the French War Minister indicated that the Germans were offering stiff resistance but the French were pursuing action on the western front to relieve Poland from German pressure.

With Great Britain now pouring in land and air expeditions to join the invasion, pressure on the great German industrial areas is becoming intense. There have been violent air bombardments with, it is said, as many as three hundred British and French planes participating in the bombing of important centres.

General Gamelin, the French commander-in-chief is personally directing operations of the mighty French army, it is said.

An official communique says that France is safe from counter invasion.

French wounded are beginning to arrive in Paris from the lines. The German high command in Berlin persists in denying that there has been any extensive fighting on the western front and has dubbed as "nonsense" French reports that the French have advanced into Germany.
