TIGHTENING BLOCKADE

The blockade against Germany seems to have been very successful so far and the new regulation preventing Germany from exporting to other countries will tighten From vancouverit much more. While a great many ships have been sunk, no appreciable dent has been made in the blockade so far. Much of the loss has been made up by seizures of German ships and goods. Some British lives have been lost but the number is very small compared with the losses in previous wars.

Convoys of ships from across the ocean and from the Mediterranean have been arriving with considerable regularity although the supplies of dairy produce have been cut off to a large extent by the blockade. Canada has been increasing her food supplies and so have Australia and New Zealand.
