WHAT IS ORE IN SIGHT?

The council of the institution of Mining and Metallurgy, London, England, the most important organization of its kind in the world, recognizing the great importance of this matter to the mining industry and to the public generally, some years ago appointed a committee to consider what steps the institution might usefully take in defining the term "Ore in Sight." After due consideration and discussion the council came to the following decision:

1. That members of the institution should not make use of the term "Ore in Sight" in their reports without indicating, in the most explicit manner, the data upon which the estimate is based; and that it is most desirable that estimates should be illustrated by drawings.

2. That as the term "Ore in Sight" is frequently used to indicate two separate factors in an estimate, namely:

(a) Ore blocked out; that is, ore exposed on at least three sides within reasonable distance of each other; and

(b) Ore which may be reasonably assumed to exist, though not actually "blocked out."

These two factors should in all cases be kept distinct, as (a) is governed by fixed rules, while (b) is dependent upon individual judgment and local experience.

3. That in making use of the term "Ore in Sight" an engineer should demonstrate that the ore so denominated is capable of being profitably extracted under the working conditions obtaining in the district.

4. That the members of the institution be urged to protect the best interests of the profession by using their influence in every way possible to prevent and discourage the use of the term "Ore in Sight," except as defined above; and the council also strongly advises that no ambiguity or mystery in this connection should be tolerated, as they (the council) consider that such ambiguity is an indication of dishonesty or incompetence.

ALASKA DESIRES ANNEXATION TO THE DOMINION OF CANADA

ADMINISTRATION OF LAW AND JUSTICE IN YUKON IMPRESSES
ALASKANS, WHO ARE JUSTLY INDIGNANT AT NEGLIGENCE OF THEIR OWN GOVERNMENT.

Vancouver, Feb. 14.—"Alaska has greater resources than any state in the Union. Its development has been, and is being, retarded by the stupid obstinacy of United States officials. It is true that Alaska is producing vast wealth, but the amount is a bagatelle to what could be accomplished if the authorities showed any decent encouragement to the miner, prospector, fisherman and agriculturist."

"I can assure you that the agitation throughout Alaska in favor of political union with Canada is no idle talk. The movement is gaining ground every day, but just how it can be realized it is difficult to say. The hardy pioneers who have braved a thousand dangers in the north hope at least that the agitation will arouse a public sentiment throughout the country and result in putting an end sooner or later to the intolerable conditions that prevail in Alaska."

In these words Mr. John Rogers, a well known mining man just down from Cordova, expressed to a representative of the Province his disapproval of the inactive policy of the federal government toward the territory. Mr. Rogers spoke with considerable feeling, declaring that the same sentiments were entertained by 98 per cent. of the population in every town and mining camp from Nome to Wrangell.

"It has become a by-word in the north," he added, "that the poor man cannot get a square deal, and that title to coal and mineral claims can only be secured through the influence of Washington lobbyists. This is probably the reason why some of the richest natural resources have passed under the control of groups of capitalists. The old timers like myself are fully aware that the administration of the mining laws in Alaska forms a lurid contrast with the square methods in vogue in the Canadian Yukon. On the British side of the line the law is plain and is enforced to the letter. The poor man has got just as good a show as the capitalist or the rich corporation."

One Good Point.

Governor Dix, at the dinner to Arnold Bennett in New York, pointed out wittily some of the faults of the self made man.

"There's one thing, though, about the self made man that I will say," said Governor Dix, with mock solemnity. "The self made man always reverences his maker."
