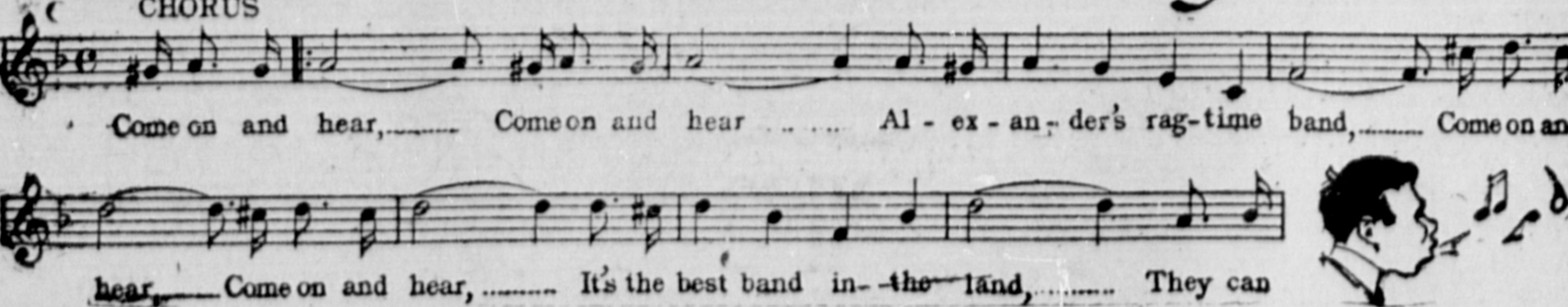

"Alexander's Rag Time Band" is sweeping the country. Its catchy tune is heard wherever men whistle and women hum. Nearly a million copies have been sold, and the song has been out only a few months. If the demand keeps up it will soon show a bigger sale than "After the Ball," the record seller up to now.

Irving Berlin wrote it. Two years ago he was a waiter in "Nigger Mike's" Chinatown saloon and restaurant. Today he is perhaps the most popular song writer in America, with an annual income of \$75,000.

The strangest part of the meiotic career of the composer of "Alexander's Rag Time Band," "My Wife's Gone to the Country," "Mesmerizing Mendelssohn Tune," "Call Me Up Some Rainy



Afternoon," "Mysterious Rag" and other song hits, is that Berlin cannot read or write one note of music.

An inspiration for a melody comes to him. He sits down at the piano—which he has learned

to play by ear—drums away until the tune harmonizes and then has someone jot down the music. Berlin was born near the Bowery, New York. When he became old enough to work he started with "Nigger Mike." After Johnny Hayes defeated Durand in the Marathon race, Berlin wrote a song "Dorando" and played it for the first time in the restaurant, where it made a big hit. He sold it to a song publisher for \$25 and the publisher made \$20,000 on it.

A short time later he was playing "Sadie Salome, Go Home" when Henry Waterson, music publisher, happened in. Waterson became interested in Berlin and offered him a job. Berlin accepted and his success since then has been without equal in the song writing world.

London, Feb. 19.—The last efforts are being made by a committee of five representing the miners and five mine owners to prevent the threatened strike. The meetings are being held secretly. The Welsh miners are not included in the negotiations and the chief constable of Wales has arranged for additional soldiers to be quartered in the towns where there were outbreaks during the recent strike.

PERILOUS AS A BATTLEFIELD

New York's Annual Chapter of
Accidents Presents Some Startling
Figures for the Consideration
of Its Authorities.

New York, Feb. 14.—The annual report of the New York board of coroners shows that 5,700 sudden deaths were reported to the coroner's office in 1911, a total of 200 more than 1910. Of these, 3,050 proved to be due to natural causes, 650 of a violent character. These included suicides, murders and accidents. The homicides by shooting or assault are 193, an increase of eight. Of the 340 casualties in Manhattan, in which death was charged to some other person, 90 were caused by automobiles, an increase of 28.

"The streets of this city are becoming more perilous than a battlefield," says the report, "and it is high time that some change in the laws governing the operation of automobiles be made." Surface cars killed 72 persons, subway trains and elevators 68, and there were 330 accidents. Of those who died 420 are still listed as "unknown dead."
