Serious Railway Disaster in Nevaci Late Sunday Morning Attributed To Sabotage

FATAL TO

CARSON CITY, Nevada, Aug. 14:-Twenty persons were killed and fifty injured in the wreck of a streamlined Southern Pacific Railway train in Central Nevada at 2:33 a.m. Sunday. A coroner's jury and the railway company declare it was a deliberate case of sabotage, the rails having been tion having been removed. The train was derailed on a small bridge while travelling at 50 to 60 miles per hour. The engine and tender were carried by momentum across the bridge but the baggage coach and other cars plunged 25 feet into Humboldt Ships Taking River. The injured include Mrs. Raymond Grubbe of Montreal and L. A. Brown of Toronto.

The wreck of the two-million dollar train occurred nineteen miles from Carlin.

The cars were so telescoped and smashed up it was impossible to count them.

Other cars on the long sleek streamliner, one of the nation's most luxurious fast trains, fell only 30 feet. The first two cars, housing diesel engines, and the third, containing the light plant, remained on the track as did the last four cars of the train. The. others jumped the rails.

Italian Foreign Minister Returns to Rome After Meeting Chanceller Adolf Hitler
