Another Unit For Defence In Prince Rupert

Major C. V. Evitt To Have Charge Of New Searchlight Battery Operating On Coast

One of the developments in connection with the defence system on this north coast is the organization of a searchlight battery under command of Major C. V. Evitt. It has vacancies for approximately twenty-five men, diesel mechanics, electricians or fitters with preference for single men.

The work is said to be very interesting and is confined absolutely to home defence. This is true of all the local services. It is officially announced here that no man will be sent overseas from the militia units. Should any be sent overseas later it will be only those who enlist especially for overseas service.

Headquarters troop will be in Prince Rupert with Lieut. Cecil Fitzgerald in command. There will be two troops at Prince George.

forts made to save peace. "It is a lie," he said "to say that Poland rejected German proposals because it was never advised of them." He added that, if attempts at conciliation were renewed, the French government was ready to join them but he declared that "France and Great Britain cannot watch the destruction of a friendly people. In effect this is a new phase of the march toward world domination by the Hitler dictatorship."

Daladier said that the government places no faith in German guarantees and that France's very existence is threatened by the German attack on Poland. Daladier paid tribute to the Italian government's efforts to maintain peace.

Daladier was granted implied authority by the Chamber of Deputies to declare war on Germany. Power was vested in a war budget bill of about one billion and a half dollars which the Chamber of Deputies adopted unanimously.

Edouard Herriot, President of the Chamber, declared after the session that there would be no need to summon Parliament again for the purpose a war declaration.

SPY FILM IS SHOWN

Sally Eilers is Star—Newspaper Story Rounds off Bill

Patriotism and personal sacrifice on the part of a heroic girl is the dual theme of Sally Eilers' dramatic vehicle, "They Made Her a Spy" at the Capitol Theatre tonight. The story deals in vivid fashion with the menace of foreign spies in the nation's capital and the efforts of secret service agencies to combat it. Miss Eilers is cast as a young lady who volunteers her services to the army military intelligence division when her brother, a lieutenant, is killed as a result of an act of foreign sabotage. At the risk of grave personal danger and deprivation, she joins a foreign espionage ring, and secretly divulges incriminating information to the government.

Rounding out tonight's picture bill is "Off the Record," a newspaper story. Pat O'Brien and Joan Blondell are co-starred in the lively drama of two star reporters who fall in love. "Off the Record" is, however, far removed from the usual run of newspaper pictures because its interest is not limited to the professional exploits of its central characters. It has an unusual theme which evolves from the warmly human side of the otherwise hard and cynical newspaper woman, portrayed by Miss Blondell, for it is her successful effort to reform and rehabilitate a tough little street gamine portrayed by Bobby Jordan.
