

Commissions Open To Warrant Ranks

LONDON, July 25: (CP)-A new scheme to facilitate promotion to commissioned officers from warrant rank, announced by the Admiralty recently, will be brought into force October 1 instead of being deferred for four years. The system, one of selection instead of seniority will see promotions made twice yearly, on April and October 1. The exceptional officer will receive promotion at from eight to 10 years seniority, the majority at about 10 years seniority and the others at from 10 to 12 years seniority. Those not regarded as, fit for promotion at 12 years seniority will be liable. at Admiralty
