In England war work is every woman's work. Practically every woman of suitable age is engaged in preparing herself to help the men in case the country should be invaded or bombed. The president of the Women's Institute of East Sussex has been telling the Victoria women about what they are doing. She says there is no panic but just a quiet determination to do what is humanly possible if war should come. They do not want to be caught!




