The electors endorsed the incurring of a liability amounting to \$21,000,000 principal and \$840,000 a year interest for thirty years. They did not agree to guarantee additional interest to the amount of \$8,400,000.

They were told by Mr. McBride that to ensure the carrying out of the contract the Canadian Northern Railway would deposit cash amounting to \$500,000 or a proper bond therefor. The government confessed in the House, in reply to Mr. Brewster, that they had accepted \$500,000 in paid-up shares, shares which are not quoted on any market so far as we can find, and which in the present state of the undertaking are valueless as security for any
