The Prince Rupert Ministerial Association, at its regular meeting yesterday, discussed the possibility of holding a series of union meetings during Lent and it was decided to take the matter up further at the next meeting.

Results of the recent Week of Prayer campaign were discussed. While it was felt that the results had been satisfactory, it was thought that a more general attendance might have been desirable. The tendency had been for people to attend only the meetings that were held in their own churches, which was by no means the object of the campaign.

Objection Taken To Cheap Annuities

Chamber of Commerce Asks That Government Place Them On Actuarial Basis

At the meeting of the Prince Rupert Chamber of Commerce last night in response to a request from the Canadian Chamber of Commerce a resolution was passed asking the federal government to place the annuities on an actuarial basis. At present it was stated, the government was losing several million dollars a year on its annuities and the people benefitting were chiefly the well-to-do people of the country who did not need it.

The resolution had already been considered by the finance committee and was recommended by it.
