LEGION IS IN SESSION

Variety of Matters Taken Up at Monthly Meeting Last Night

At a well attended meeting of the Prince Rupert branch of the Canadian Legion of the British Empire Service League last night the report of the meeting of the various ex-soldier organizations under the chairmanship of the Dominion President Col. W. W. Foster was heard with gratification. There are some other exservice organizations besides the Canadian Legion. These include the Sir Arthur Pearson Club for Blinded Soldiers, the Canadian Pensioners' Association, Amputations' Association, Army and Navy Veterans in Canada and the Canadian Corps Association. During the world crisis of September the various ex-soldier associations realized the need for the ex-service men being in a position to speak with one voice. Through the crisis appears to have passed the unification of the separate units into a National Veterans' Conference is still apparent and through the efforts of Col. Foster such a meeting was called and was entirely successful.

Letters of thanks from various organizations were read including one from the Boys' Club for tables and chairs donated by the legion to the club. Explanation was made in connection with the recent legislation extending the benefits of hospitalization and treatment to non-pensioned veterans. The extent of the benefits was indicated as well as the limitations.

In connection with the fund for sending of children to Victoria for the Royal visit the Legion was pleased with the report of the splendid support given by the various organizations and the many events that have been planned to make the venture a success. The matter of the limiting age was considered and it was felt that the committee might consider raising the age limit to include all children attending High School. It was recognized that, while the impressions made on children of twelve years or so would be lasting and the participation in such an epoch marking function as a visit of the heads of the Empire could never be erased, yet the more mature children still attending school would probably derive even greater benefit.

The applications of John William Bond and William Craig were favorably considered for membership. A communication from the provincial office in connection with the G. H. Greenwood case was also read.



Whifflets From The Waterfront

Armour Buys Grier Starrett—Outfit Going to Hastings Arm for Gravel—Masset Wharf Work to Start Soon

The well known Prince Rupert fish packer Grier Starrett has been purchased by the Armour Salvage Co. from the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co. Following a complete reconditioning and painting being given the vessel, Capt. Paul Armour manager of the Armour Salvage Co., left last night with her for Vancouver where, unless it is disposed of, the intention is to equip the Starrett with a larger engine replacing the present 45 h.p. Fairbanks-Morse diesel. The Starrett was originally built at Gig Harbor, Washington, in 1912 but for many years has been owned and operated by the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co. in connection with its fish packing services. The vessel is sixty-five feet long overall with beam of seventeen feet and depth of six feet.

Laden with seventy creosoted piles, a six hundred ton scow, chartered by the Armour Salvage Co., arrived a few days ago from Vancouver in tow of the tug P.W. The scow and piles will be taken later to Massett in connection with a wharf rebuilding job which the Armour company has been awarded by the federal Department of Public Works.

About Saturday the Armour Salvage Co. will be sending the power tugs Daly and Pachena with derrick
