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**PULP INDUSTRY**

The era of pulped products is now beginning, according to R. J. Filberg, timber operator, who addressed the Canadian Society of Forest Engineers recently in Vancouver. **THE REAL CAUSE**

According to some minor authorities everybody is wrong on the matter of unemployment. The improvements in machinery have very little to do with it and the depression also is not the cause. Correspondents at Ottawa who a few weeks ago were saying there was little likelihood of an election this year are now changing their minds and suggesting that a Dominion election is likely to be held this year. They base their opinions not on any statement or announcement that has been made by the government but on the fact that the government is bringing down legislation which they think will be popular.

"If any dictator in the world has made up his mind that the British Commonwealth is going to be disrupted, he is basing his future project on an absolute fallacy," declared Right Hon. Ernest Lapointe, leader of the Quebec section of the Liberal representation in the House of Commons, in a recent speech in the House. He opposes conscription but he believes in the Empire and its future. He made a strong plea for national unity and for adequate defences. He suggested that if the Empire were attacked there would be immediately such a wave of public sentiment that would force any government to intervene.

**KRIEGER IS BEST**

Won Ten Round Decision In Seattle Last Night Over Allan Matthews

SEATTLE, April 6:—Solly Kreiger, world's middleweight boxing champion, won an unpopular but unquestioned decision in a ten round non-title bout here last night with Allan Matthews.

It was a hard fight and Matthews made a good showing until the seventh when Kreiger sent him to his knees for the count of four with a hard right to the stomach and rights and lefts to the chin.

By the same process Kreiger sent Matthews down in the ninth round for a nine-count.

Matthews came back and made a whirlwind finish in the tenth but Kreiger's lead on points was too great to be overcome.

**NEW CHAMP BORN HERE**

Prince Rupert Native Son Wins Provincial Lightweight Boxing Title

Paddy Binns of North Vancouver, who won the lightweight boxing crown of British Columbia in Vancouver recently, was born at Prince Rupert General Hospital in May 1921, being the son of Mr. and Mrs. W. F. (Paddy) Binns of the Skeena district where Paddy senior was chief accountant at the Balmoral Cannery.

Young Binns had a very successful season, also reaching the semi-finals of the Northwest Golden Gloves Championship in Seattle last November, defeating opponents from Seattle, Everett, and Pottlatch, Washington, before losing a close decision to the eventual winner, Tom Moyer of Portland, in the semi-finals. He also had numerous victories over Fort Lewis and British Columbia boxers.

Paddy is one of the most popular boys in the game, being noted for his clean tactics, and good sportsmanship in the ring.

In addition to winning the championship cup, he was also awarded a special trophy for being the winner of the best bout of the evening.

**Oshawa Evens Up With Verdun; Elks Of Brandon Win**

TORONTO, April 6: (CP)—Oshawa Generals defeated Verdun Maple Leafs 6 to 1 last night to even up the count in the eastern semi-finals for the Memorial Cup, emblematic of world's junior hockey championship. In the west Brandon Elks stayed in the running by defeating Edmonton Rangers 5 to 0 after losing the first two games by scores of 6 to nil.

**SPORT CHAT**

Burly Lawson Little, who won two American and two British golf titles in succession, making golf history, turned professional just three years ago. Little's only major victory since he turned pro was in the 1938 Canadian open at Toronto.

Hockey overtime records were broken when Boston Bruins met Toronto Maple Leafs at Toronto for the National Hockey League title five years ago. After 164 minutes, 46 seconds of play, Ken Doraty scored the only goal, giving the Leafs the crown. This record was broken by Montreal Maroons and Detroit in Montreal in 1937, when they played 176 minutes, 30 seconds, before the Red Wings won, 1-0.

Moncton Hawks won the Allan Cup for the second consecutive year by defeating Fort William Thunderbolt 5-1 in the third of a best-of-three series five years ago in Toronto. The victory was not unexpected, although the Hawks played without their star centre, Bert Connolly who was injured.

BOSTON, April 6: (CP)—The Toronto Maple Leafs arrived here today to meet Boston Bruins tonight in the opening game of the finals for the Stanley Cup, emblematic of world's professional hockey championship. Both teams are confident of winning.
