MONTGOMERY DEMANDS SECRET

of all men was opposed to hole and corner methods, but said that still they were sometimes necessary. He stood to his guns firmly. He would give out the matter at Wednesday's private meeting. This meeting Alderman Montgomery rather thought he would not attend as a protest against star chamber methods. However, he expressed readiness to be guided by the opinion of the Council as a whole, though he flatly refused to be dictated to by the Mayo ralone.
Mayor Newton went on to say that the powers with whom the city was dealing had requested private proceedings and added that if Alderman Montgomery thought he could chivy him into any other method than Alderman Montgomery was much mistaken.
At once Alderman Montgomery took exception to this personal attack, and rose to the point of order that the Mayor should address himself to the Council as a whole and not to any one member. The Mayor thought that Alderman Montgomery had merited the departure in this case.
"I had a right to this information," broke in the Alderman, and with equal emphasis the Mayor asserted his own right to take his stand regarding the keeping of any matters private.
It was resolved to hold the star chamber meeting on Wednesday at 7 p. m. in the new fire hall.

THEY DON'T LIKE LLOYD GEORGE
Aristocratic Vicar of Sussex Parish to Leave Old England Because of the Chancellor's Taxation Measures.
Rev. W. E. Walker, rector of Frant, Sussex, with his wife, Lady Emily Walker, daughter of the Marquis of Hartford, with their five children and maid and footman, have announced they will sail for Canada in July. They intend to take forty acres near Vancouver, where Mr. Walker will engage in dairy farming and Lady Emily will raise chickens, in which pursuit she has been interested for years.
"There are two reasons for my going to America," said Mr. Walker. "The first is that under Lloyd George we're taxed out of existence, and I see no future in this country. I wish we had left long ago."
Lady Emily backed up her husband. "If you make money," she said, "Lloyd George can't run away with it."
Then Mr. Walker continued: "It is the children we are thinking of and that's the second cause of our starting in life afresh. In that wonderful country over the sea we shall all be able to settle down together and my boys will have a fair chance of making good in the world."
"I shall attend to the poultry," Lady Emily said, "and my husband will superintend the dairy, and of course the children will be brought up on the farm."
