Whifflets From The Waterfront

Indian Agent James Gillett left early this afternoon aboard the departmental cruiser Naskeena for a trip to Port Simpson, Kipcolith and Stewart on official duties. He expects to be back early next week. Miss Amelia Susman, ethnologist from Columbia University, New York, who intends to spend some time at Port Simpson engaged in research work, left for Simpson with the Naskeena.

Capt. Larry Thomson, well known Vancouver pilot, sails tonight by the Prince Rupert on his return to Vancouver after having handled a ship here. Capt. A. W. Ogden, who has been stationed here as pilot in connection with the local naval examination service, will sail by the Princess Adelaide tomorrow night on his return to Vancouver. Capt. Walter Gosse is coming north on the Adelaide tomorrow afternoon to relieve him.

Alaska Transportation Co.'s steamer Taku arrived in port at 11 o'clock yesterday morning from Ketchikan and, after discharging fish for transshipment East over Canadian National Railways, sailed at 1 p.m. in continuation of her voyage to Seattle.

C. N. R. steamer Prince John, Capt. Neil McLean, arrived in port at 2:50 this morning from Vancouver via the Queen Charlotte Islands and will be here until Friday night at 10:30 when she will sail on her return south over the same route.

TROOPS TO ENTERTAIN
