POLAND APOLOGIZES

WARSAW-The Polish Foreign Office apologized to the German ambassador today after students had broken through police lines and smashed two windows in the German embassy in an anti-German demonstration.

DRIVING OUT JEWS

BERLIN-Police authorities today served notice on the Jewish community that, effective Monday, it must furnish each day names of 100 Jews who would then be required to leave the country within two weeks. The order caused consternation in Jewish circles which had hoped to be permitted to wind up their affairs without undue pressure.

ITALIANS LEAVE FRANCE

PARIS-Several thousand Italian citizens living in France packed today and prepared to board trains in a mass return to their native land in response to Premier Mussolini's repatriation order for Italians abroad. A Rome dispatch said that foreign circles there regarded the mass home coming as a further gesture of ill-feeling toward France.

FREDERIKSEN'S BOAT FOUND
