DUTCH APPLE CAKE

1 cake pan-cut 3 x 5-15 servings

Butter	2	CZS.	Baking Powder 31/2 tsp.
Sugar			Salt
Egg			Apples15
Milk	134	cups	Cinnamon 1 tsp.
Flour			Fruit Sugar 1 cup

METHOD: Peel apples, cut in 1/6ths, and steam for 5 minutes, or until soft. Cream butter, and sugar; add egg. Add milk and sifted dry ingredients alternately. Spread in pan. Place apples on top with cut side pressed into batter. Mix cinnamon and sugar and sprinkle over top. Bake at 400 degrees for 20 minutes. N.B.—Number of apples depends on size.
