## Absolute Autonomy Of Gov't Condemned By Pope Pius In First Encyclical Of Reign CASTEL GANLOLFO, October 27: (CP)-

Pope Pius today condemned governments which assume "that absolute autonomy which belongs to the Supreme Maker" and offered consolation to dismembered Poland. In the first encyclical of his reign, the Pontiff, after recounting the failure of his efforts for peace, also pleaded for a settlement at the end of this war which would avoid the errors of past treaties which had failed to bring lasting peace.

The Pope blamed denial of "the authority of God and the sway of His law" for the rise of governments which make the state "the last end of life."


