WAIVED CLAIM BY A MISTAKE

J. Jabour Makes an Effort in Council to Have His Building on Third Avenue Raised 20 Inches at City Expense.

Claiming that he signed a petition waiving his claim on the city for any damage accruing through change of grade on Third avenue, J. Jabour last night appealed to the Council by letter and in person to have his building raised 20 or 22 inches to get it on grade. He wanted this work done at city expense. The matter is referred to the City Engineer and the Board of Works.

MAY ARBITRATE M'MORDIE CASE

Proposal to Have Old Contract Dispute Arbitrated Instead of Going to Appeal—Situation Unsettled—May Have Meeting.

There is a proposition hanging in the balance by which possibly the settlement of the case of Mc-Mordie vs. City may be settled by arbitration. This, City Solicitor Peters frankly told the Council last night, would be costly, \$25 per day for each arbitrator and the lawyers' fees, too, which would be much more because a judge can keep lawyers within bounds, while as a rule a trio of arbiters cannot.

Unless the city can agree to arbitration the City Solicitor must enter the city's defense in the appeal pending. Mr. Peters' recommendation is rather toward an effort at mutual agreement between McMordie and the Council at a special meeting, which may be held this week.
