
CHRISTIAN SCIENTISTS WELCOME KING

Statement By City Commissioner In Regard to Letter Published Yesterday

In reference to a letter from Fred Riffou published yesterday in regard to the new water main construction program here, City Commissioner W. J. Alder stated this morning that annual princiiral and interest payment under the terms of the governmental loan which is being obtained will be no more than it cost last year to repair breaks in the section to be replaced. The money is being borrowed at two percent and in-Iterest and sinking fund will

amount to but \$1769 per year. In regard to Mr. Riffou's suggestion that he (Mr. Alder) will "resign some day and stay just long enough to get out." the commissioner points ot that he has been one of the largest individual taxpayers in the city since its incention and he expects that he will continue to be so.
