COPPER FIND AT HAZELTON

Profitable Development on Rocher
ed Boule Property—Big Ledge
of Hundred and Forty Feet—
Work on American Boy.

Close to the Kelly townsite, upon the Roche de Boule property an important strike of four feet of yellow copper and one foot of galena and gray copper has been made on the crosscut. Total mineralized vein matter runs about eight feet.

The property is operated by John F. Cowan of Salt Lake and W. P. D. Pemberton of Victoria. This find gives a depth of one hundred and forty feet on the big ledge. A compressed air plant and a tram system are being installed.

The Harris boys expect to tap their big galena and gray copper lead this week. They have already driven a tunnel three hundred feet this winter on the American Boy.

MISSING HEIR TO EARLDOM

Lord Leitrim, Now in Florida,
Still Vainly Searches for Lost
Brother, with Whom Vanishes
the Title.

Lord Leitrim, an Irish earl with large estates in the north of Ireland, is now spending two months in Florida fishing for tarpon. A romantic interest attaches to his visit because for the past five years Lord Leitrim has been searching for his lost brother, the Hon. Frank Clements, who is sole heir to his large estates. If the heir is not found the title to the estates and the peerage becomes extinct upon the earl's death. Clements is known to have come to America, after training for the royal navy, as a stoker on an American steamer in 1907, and then he disappeared.

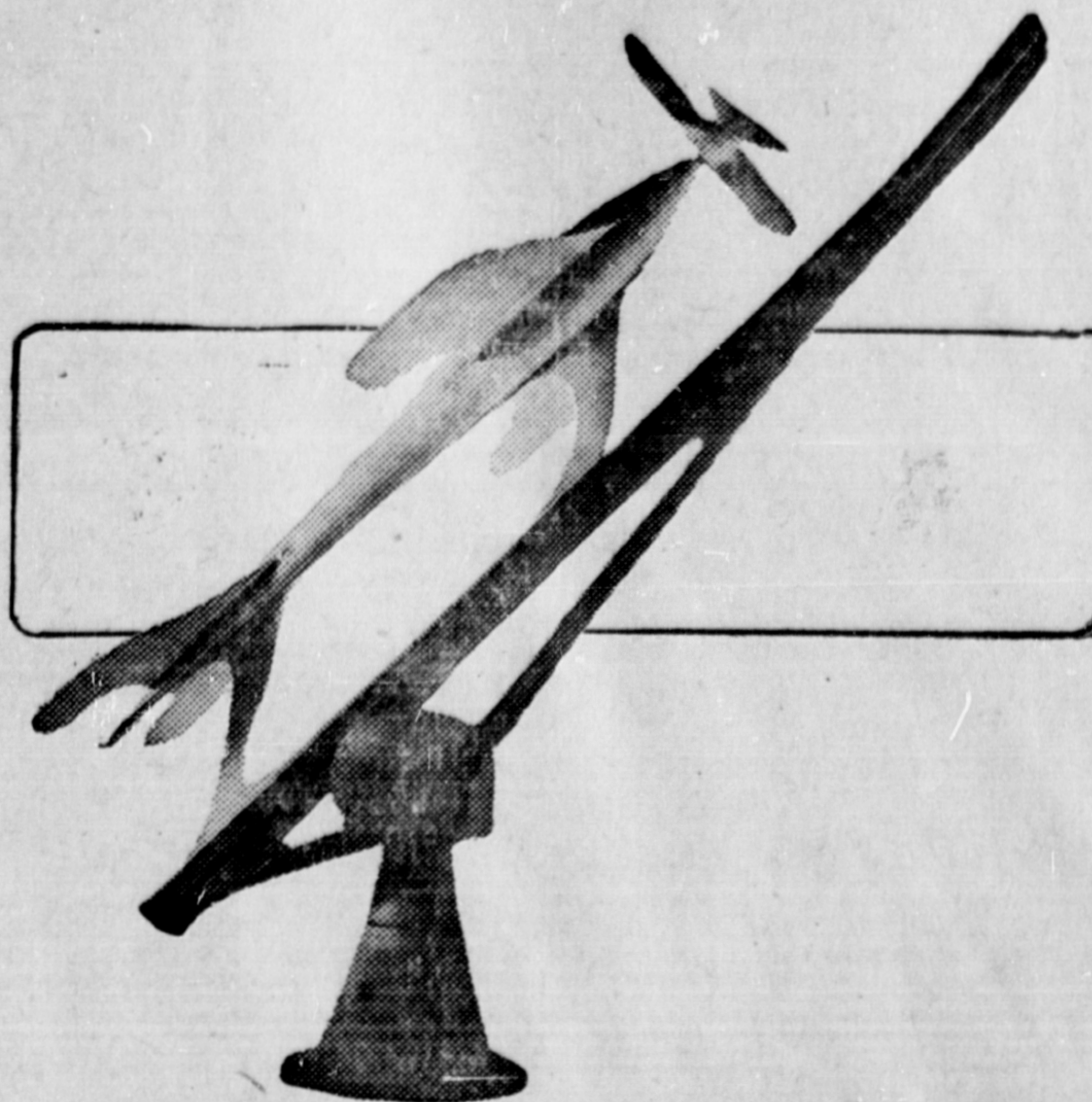

NEW RUSSIAN COLONIZATION

Rumored Large Scale Scheme for
the Peopling of Fertile Naas
Basin Valleys with Good Class
of Russian Immigrants.

It is rumored on good author-
ity in the city today that there
is a large scale scheme on foot
for the colonization of one or
other of the valleys in the Naas
River basin with Russian im-
migrants who are being selected
carefully in the land of the Czar.
The district on which the spot
light fixes at present for the pro-
posed colony is in the Kitwanooc
Valley, which, though fertile and
suitable for settlement, is as yet
very sparsely peopled. At pres-
ent, however, the best informa-
tion available on the subject de-
clines to confirm the rumor.

As will be remembered, re-
cently Father Hartman of the
Roman Catholic Church here had
in hand propositions for a Ger-
man colonization of the Naas
Valley which is still awaiting de-
velopments.

POPE'S HEALTH IS GOOD

His Holiness Pius X Has Made a
Good Recovery.

Rome, March 1.—The pope has
completely recovered from the
slight indisposition mainly caused
by fatigue and nervous strain,
from which he suffered after the
consistory and its attendant
ceremonies.
