GRAND TRUNK'S NEW DOCK

Formal Opening Fittingly Celebrated—Most Up to Date in Vancouver—Trip Around Sound Feature of Program.

The formal opening of the new Grand Trunk dock in Vancouver was a fitting celebration to which many invitations were issued by Captain C. H. Nicholson to shipping and business men of Vancouver. The entertaining took place on board the steamer Prince George before her departure on the first trip of the season. The program included a cruise around the sound and everyone voted the affair a most delightful success. The company is moving its offices to the new dock, which is the most up to date in Vancouver. The dock is 870 feet long and the greater portion is 350 feet wide. Every facility has been provided for the storage and handling of fuel oil for the steamers.

NEW COAST STEAMERS

To Be Placed in Service of Pacific Coast Steamship Co.

Tenders are being called for the construction of two large passenger steamers, to be 17 per cent. larger than either the President or Governor of the Pacific Coast Steamship Company.

The contract for the first of the two steamers will be let next month. The new vessel will be a twin screw steamship, like the Governor, and about the same design. Her engines will be of sufficient power to enable her to maintain 18 1/2 knots an hour as compared with 16 1/2 knots, the maximum speed of the President and Governor. The dimensions of the new liner show that she is twenty-five feet longer than the Governor and five feet wider. The new vessel will have passenger accommodations for 626 passengers, 418 first cabin, 108 second cabin and 100 steerage.

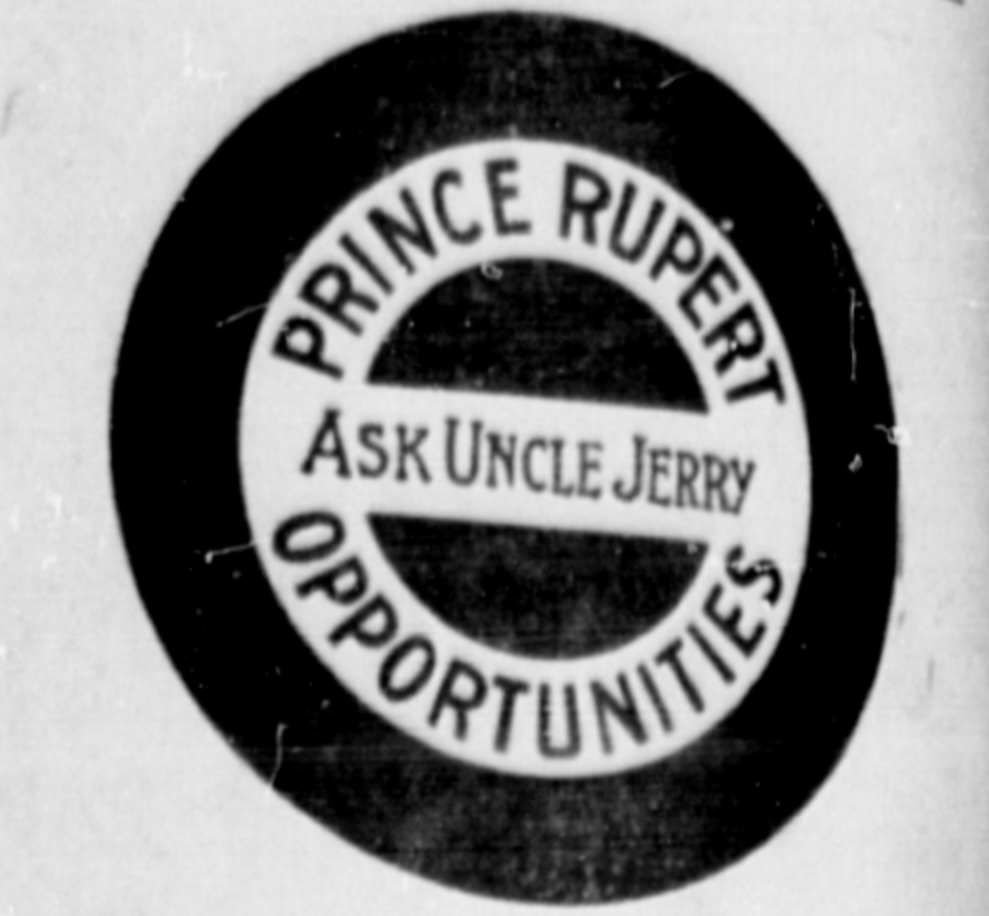
